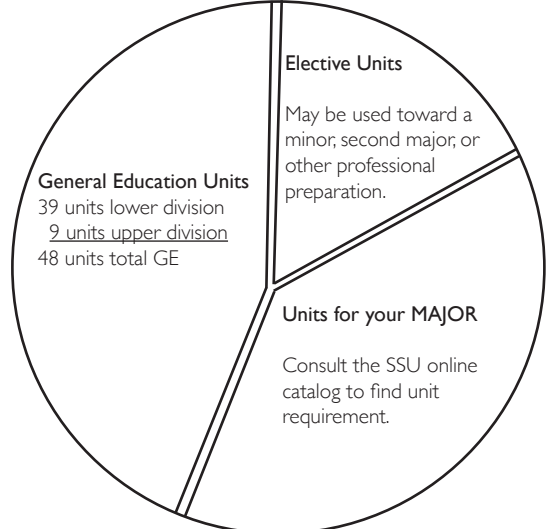
- ☆ If you have a major, contact your major department office for referral to your advisor in your major.

GRADUATION

- ☆ Graduation is not automatic. We recommend filing your application one year in advance of graduation. This allows earlier communication with you so there is ample time to meet with an advisor and resolve any concerns before your final semester. The deadline to apply for graduation each semester is posted on the Graduation website and Academic Calendar.
- ☆ If you are denied graduation, you must file a "Change of Graduation Information" Form to move your graduation date. This is not done automatically.

Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR)

The Graduation Writing Assessment Requirement (GWAR) is intended to ensure that all students graduating from a California State University have acquired the writing skills necessary for competent written communication. At Sonoma State University, there are two ways students may complete the GWAR: either by passing the Written English Proficiency Test (WEPT) or by achieving a grade of "C" or better in a course designated as WIC (Writing Intensive Curriculum).
 Note: The Writing Intensive Curriculum courses list is subject to change term-by-term. Check periodically for updates.
